Referral

When a specialty care service outside of a GHC-SCW clinic is needed, members should start by scheduling a visit with their PCP to receive a referral. Prior authorization is automatically generated when a referral is submitted.

Where can I go for care?

How do I transition my care?

A Transition of Care form will need to be completed for each person who needs transition assistance. The member would need Transition of Care if any of the following situations apply:

- Under active treatment of a specialist (not primary care provider) and has an appointment(s) scheduled within 90 days of starting with GHC-SCW
- Have a surgery, procedure, advanced imaging, or infusion scheduled within 90 days of starting with GHC-SCW
- Currently pregnant
- Use durable medical equipment
- Taking prescribed medications

Do I need a GHCMyChartSM Account?

Yes. A GHCMychartSM account can be used to schedule appointments, refill prescriptions, view select test results and more!

Can I visit another UW Health or UnityPoint Health-Meriter clinic other than my designated primary care clinic for services?

Your Primary Care Provider (PCP) will coordinate all your medical care, which should be received at your primary care clinic. If your PCP is out of the office, you can be seen by another provider on your primary care team. Additionally, labs and routine X-rays may be received from any UW Health provider location for any UW Health primary care member; or from any UnityPoint Health-Meriter location for any UnityPoint Health-Meriter primary care member.

Terms to Know

Primary Care Provider (PCP): A PCP is a health care provider who provides primary care to the member. The PCP also helps provide continuity of care and coordinate services, if necessary, with recommended Specialty Care Providers. A PCP may be a Family Medicine Physician, an Internal Medicine Physician, a Pediatrician, a Physician Assistant or a Nurse Practitioner.

Referral: The referral request occurs when you visit your PCP, and a decision is made to send you to a specific Specialist.

Prior Authorization: Prior authorization is the process by which GHC-SCW provides prior written approval for coverage of specific benefits, treatments, Durable and Disposable Medical Equipment (DME), Prescription Drugs and supplies.

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
