Our services include the following:

Social & Emotional Skills Development

For ages 4 to 16 - emotional skills 6 to 16, social skills 4 to 16. The child must be able to communicate in full sentences. **Settings:** In-clinic (available for Wisconsin residents) and in-home (available for Dane County residents), telehealth as appropriate.

Focus: Helping children and teens build emotional awareness, self-regulation and social interaction skills. Includes:

- Peer interaction and relationship-building
- Emotional regulation strategies
- Parent coaching and support

Speech and Language Therapy

For ages 3 to 18.

Settings: Clinic-based, telehealth as appropriate. **Focus:** Supporting communication, language development and social-pragmatic skills. Includes:

- Making speech sounds (articulation and phonology)
- Understanding and using language (expressive and receptive language)
- Using devices, signs or other ways to communicate (augmentative and alternative communication)
- Social communication such as self-advocacy and perspective-taking

We offer neuroaffirming and multidisciplinary, evidence-based services to patients diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and their parents/caregivers.

Our approach leverages the expertise of various professionals while maintaining the family at the center of all decision-making processes.

Occupational Therapy

For ages 3 to 18.

Settings: Clinic-based, telehealth as appropriate. **Focus:** Enhancing sensory processing, motor skills and daily living abilities. Includes:

- Understanding and managing sensory needs
- Building strong hand and finger skills
- Learning self-care skills
- Improving focus, planning and problem-solving
